



The **Teaching Packs** Jukebox plays sixty different music tracks and sixty different sound effects! These are all organised into different categories. The player also has a full-screen option, volume controls, a looping option and more!

Try using the jukebox tool in some of the following ways...

- Play the music quietly in the background while children are working. Does music help them to focus or does it distract them?
- Use the music and sound effects as background audio during role play and drama activities.
- Discuss how the children feel about music. When do they listen to it? What types of music do they prefer?
- Listen to the one of the tracks. What instruments can the children hear? How would they describe the track?
- Compare two tracks two different categories. How are they similar / different?
- Discuss how the music tracks are sorted. What makes a piece of music 'upbeat', 'relaxing' or 'sad'?
- Listen to one of the tracks without telling the children its name. What does it make them think of? Can they think of a new name for the track?
- The tracks in the jukebox are all 'instrumental'. What does this mean? Could they think of some lyrics to accompany one of the tracks?
- The player shows the length of each track. Could your children sort some of the tracks in order of length? Can they work out the total length of two (or more) different tracks? Could they calculate the difference between the lengths of two different tracks? If they were a DJ and had to play four tracks in a ten minute 'set', which tracks would they choose?
- Challenge your children to make their own jukebox tool using Powerpoint, Scratch or another program / application.
- Use the jukebox as a treat during 'golden time' or end of term celebrations.
